The New World and Oceania are divided into several 'colonial regions' for the purpose of forming colonial nations. There are twelve colonial regions in the game, 11 in the Americas (7 in North America, 4 in South America) and 1 covering Australia and New Zealand. As long as the conditions are met, any nation in the game can spawn colonial nations, from large and wealthy empires like Ming or a united Bharat to small and poor minor nations like Iceland .
