Elegiac Poetry. Like other ancient Greek generic terms, “elegy” is difficult to define; the best recent attempts are West 1974 and Bowie 1986.A key characteristic is a metrical structure comprising a sequence of elegiac couplets, an elegiac couplet consisting of a dactylic hexameter followed by a pentameter (an “elegeion” in Greek terminology).

He was the first Greek poet known to express concern over the eventual fate and survival of his own ...

The Greeks had two kinds of lyric poetry: the individual’s song and the choir, that was very popular. At the turn of the 7th and 6th century BC on the island Lesbos lived a poetry Alcaeus and Sappho. Alcaeus was singing hymns and odas, and Sappho about love and friendship. Anacreon from Tea sang about love and wine.
