GROWING CASSAVA - IITA

Although new commercial, medium-scale cassava farmers are beginning to emerge in some cassava growing countries, such as in DRC, Ghana and Nigeria, most of them use only some and not all available or recently developed modern techniques that can increase efficiency of growing and processing cassava.

GROWING CASSAVA

Cassava planting commences in April and can go on till October. 60-65 bundles of cassava stem per hectare is recommended as planting material. Each bundle of cassava stem goes for #300. 25cm long cuttings from cassava stem is usually planted using a spacing of 1metre by 1metre (1mx1m).

How to Start Cassava Farming Business in Nigeria

In Nigeria, cassava is usually grown at the subsistence level by small-scale farmers who sell the surplus. The plant thrives in poor soil and cassava farming is not labor intensive.
